

It is said that Santorini is all that is left of the lost city of Atlantis.

Delphi and Temple of Apollo

After the Acropolis, Delphi (UNESCO World Heritage site) is the most popular archaeological site in Greece, considered the center of the world, the place where heaven and earth met. Recognized as the center of worship for the god of Apollo, son of Zeus, people today believe the "Oracle of Delphi" still creates a spiritual experience. The Doric Temple of Apollo was the home of Pythia, the priestess who channeled the spirit of the gods, predicting the future. Before the fire which destroyed the temple, the walls were inscribed with the ancient wisdom of "Know Thyself" and "Nothing in Excess," still meaningful today.

The open-air theater of Epidaurus (UNESCO World Heritage site) is known for its outstanding acoustics and is the best preserved in all of Greece. Today it is still used for live performances.

Tel Aviv/Caesarea/Nazareth

The second largest city in Israel on the Mediterranean coast, Tel Aviv is a bustling metropolis with a diverse population. Often called "The White City" for its UNESCO-designated Bauhaus architecture, Tel Aviv boasts an amazing blend of ancient and contemporary sites. Visit Rabin Square, see Independence Hall where David Ben Gurion declared Israel's independence in May 1948 and Neve Tzedek with its historic homes and art galleries. Continue on to Caesarea, built by King Herod and its ancient Roman theatre, still used today. It was from here that Paul the Apostle, as a prisoner, sailed on his hazardous journey to Rome. Stand in awe of the ancient hippodrome, the Crusader moat and massive aqueduct.

Then continue to Nazareth, where you will visit the Basilica of the Annunciation and St. Joseph's Church before arriving in Tiberias.

Mount of the Beatitudes and Tabgha


Drive along the Sea of Galilee as Biblical sites come into view. Stop at the Mount of Beatitudes, the church with the octagonal dome where Jesus blessed his disciplines some 2,000 years ago and gave his sermon on the mount. Go to Tabgha, where Jesus fed the 5,000 with two fish and five loaves of bread. Visit the Church of the Primacy of St Peter and Capernaum, where Jesus performed many miracles during his ministry. Enjoy a traditional St. Peter's Fish lunch at Ein Gev and experience first-hand what daily life is really like on a kibbutz, Israel's communal living system. Sail across the Sea of Galilee and see the Yardenit Baptismal Site on the Jordan River.

Beit Shean - Remarkable Excavations of Roman and Byzantine Cities

Explore the fascinating ruins of Beit Shean, one of the most magnificent Roman archeological sites in Israel. Walk among the ruins of the Roman baths, theatre and amphitheatre. Travel through the Jordan Valley passing by Jericho along the winding desert highway ascending some 4,000 feet to Jerusalem.

Jerusalem - The Eternal City

Your city tour includes many Biblical and historical sites important in Judaism, Christianity and Islam. Drive up to the Mt. of Olives for beautiful panoramic views of the Holy City. Next visit the Garden of Gethsemane, the Basilica of Agony and the Tomb of the Virgin Mary. Enter through Damascus Gate and enjoy a walking tour of the Old City, the Four Quarters through the Muslim, Christian, Jewish and Armenian quarters. Walk up the Via Dolorosa to Calvary Hill, regarded in Catholicism as the site where Christ was crucified and ascended into heaven. After lunch, walk through the narrow "souk" of Jerusalem to the Western Wall - the only remaining wall of Herod's Temple and through the rebuilt Jewish Quarter. Wander through the Cardo, the reconstructed shopping arcade of Roman times.

Optional Excursion to the Dead Sea and Masada

Drive through the Jordan Valley and the Judean Wilderness. Pass by the beautiful waterfalls of Ein Gedi, an oasis some 1200 feet below sea level. Ascend by cable car to Masada and marvel at the ancient ruins of King Herod's fortress, the last stronghold of the Jewish Rebellion against the Romans. Witness the well-preserved





fortifications, waterworks, temples and palaces. Take a swim (or float) in the Dead Sea. See the Qumran Caves, where the earliest Biblical documents, the Dead Sea Scrolls, were discovered, possibly written by the first century sect, the Essenes.

Optional Excursion to Bethlehem and Yad Vashem Holocaust Memorial

Visit the birthplace of Jesus in Bethlehem. See Manger Square, Church of the Nativity where Jesus was born and Grotto of the Nativity, buried under the Greek monastery.

On another optional excursion, tour the museum of Yad Vashem, a memorial to the six million Jews murdered during the Holocaust. This living museum has been entrusted with documenting the history of the Jewish people during the Holocaust period, preserving the memory and story of each of the six million victims, and imparting the legacy of the Holocaust for generations to come.

Treasures of Jordan

Travel on to Jordan crossing the Allenby Bridge. Visit Madaba to view the 6th-century mosaic map in St. George's Church. Enjoy panaoramic views of the Jordan Valley, a visit to Mount Nebo, alleged burial place of Moses and The Dead Sea.

Enjoy a morning tour of Petra, the Rose Red city. Here walk the Siq, a narrow gorge that leads into the city of Petra, emerging dramatically in front of the Treasury along the way. It is impossible to describe the feeling of standing at the foot of the Treasury, look-

ing up at some of the amazing carvings and sharp lines that have survived for all these years. Also see The Monastery, the Silk Tomb and the Roman Colonnade and Amphitheater which could seat 7,000.

On a morning tour of Amman, the capital of Jordan, see a fascinating city of contrasts - a unique blend of old and new, ideally situated on a hilly area between the desert and the fertile Jordan Valley. See the Citadel, the Roman Theater and a view of the residential areas.

Optional Excursion to Jerash

Visit the former Roman city of Jerash. This ancient city is considered to be one of the best preserved Roman sites in the world. This is due to the fact that Jerash was buried in sand for centuries. The history of Jerash goes back to prehistoric times, and on the slopes east of the Triumphal Arch can be found flint implements which show that here was the site of the Neolithic settlement. Outside the walls to the north was a small Early Bronze Age village dating back 2500 BC, and on the hilltops above are remains of an old burial ground.

Beijing - Capital city of the Peoples Republic of China

Start your odyssey in Beijing, a vibrant, modern and exciting city coexisting with a rich and at times turbulent history. Beijing is the heart, soul and spirit of this mysterious and mystical land. The haunting beauty of Old Cathay still remains: yellow-tiled temple roofs curve against a lacquered sky; old and mellow pagodas grace nearby hills.



Xian

Xian, once known as Changan, served as the capital of 11 dynasties and was a center for major trade between China and Central Asia. Xian is a city of astounding archeological and art discoveries. On an optional orientation tour of this remarkable city see the Big Wild Goose Pagoda, built in 652 AD, as well as the Bell and Drum Towers.

Xian today is famous for one of history's most exciting archaeological finds, the "buried army" of 8,000 life-size Terra Cotta warriors and horses who guarded the entrance of Emperor Qin Shi Huangdi's tomb for more than 2,000 years. The "army" covering more than three acres comprises infantry soldiers, archers, cavalry, chariot drivers and officers, with each chariot driven by four pottery horses.

Chongqing

Fly from Xian to Chongqing, today the largest industrial and commercial city in Sichuan Province. During the Second World War, Chongqing was headquarters for Chiang Kai-Shek and his nationalist government and also the base for the Flying Tigers who made their historic flights over the "Hump," (the Himalayan Mountain Range) to Burma.


THE PANAMA CANAL

The Eighth Wonder of the Modern World

The dream to cut a path across Panama to shorten the dangerous journey around South America's Cape Horn began with the Spanish explorers in the 16th century. The Frenchman Ferdinand de Lesseps began the effort after his triumphant completion of the Suez Canal in 1879. His plan collapsed into bankruptcy in 1889, and President Theodore Roosevelt took up the cause in 1902.

A river was dammed to create what was then the world's largest artificial lake. An eight-mile channel was cut through a mountain range and more than 200 million cubic yards of earth and stone were cleared. Six immense locks, with walls 1,000 feet long and 81 feet high, took four years to build. The massive doors on the locks each weigh nearly 750 tons.

Working conditions for the more than 35,000 laborers were excruciatingly difficult. Typhoid, malaria and other tropical diseases were a constant threat, and temperatures often rose to 130 degrees. Even with all the travails, this marvel of human ingenuity was finally completed in 1913, a year ahead of schedule and \$23 million under budget. The first vessel through the Canal was the tugboat, Gatun, which fulfilled a dream hundreds of years in the making.



The village of La Fortuna is ringed by mountains and inhabited by friendly folk whose little shops may offer the perfect memento.

There are few places on earth where you can observe an active volcano, and we will spend a day near Arenal Volcano, one of the most active volcanoes in the Americas. Since it erupted 400 years ago, it has continued to light up the night sky. From our observation point,

we feel the ground tremble and see smoke that billows from the earth's molten core rise to join the clouds. After a day of adventure, relax at the Tabacon Grand Spa followed by dinner with lovely views of the resort's hot springs, lush tropical gardens and Arenal Volcano. 


